

September Half Yearly Report 2017

In September HYA 2017, 97 % of schools have entered data. Across districts, it is more than state average in 11 districts named Ambala, Faridabad, Fatehabad, Gurugram, Hisar, Jhajjar, Karnal, Mahendergarh, Panipat, Rewari and Sirsa. It is at par the state average in 4 districts, named Bhiwani, Jind, Kaithal, Mewat and Sonipat. In rest of the districts, it is less than the state average (Table 1).

Attendance of students in September HYA 2017 is 94% at state level. Across districts, attendance is more than state average in 14 districts namely, Ambala, Bhiwani, Fatehabad, Hisar, Jhajjar, Jind, , Kurukshetra, Mahendergarh, Panchkula, Rewari, Rohtak , Sirsa, Sonipat, Yamuna Nagar. It is less than state average in 5 districts named Faridabad, Gurugram, Mewat, Palwal and Panipat. It is at the state average in 2 districts named Kaithal and Karnal (Table 2).

In September HYA 2017, Mahendergarh and Sonipat district are in tie for first position. Rewari and Jhajjar districts are in tie for second position. Gurugram is at third position. However Mewat, Yamuna Nagar, Karnal and Palwal are the bottom performing districts (Table 3).

In September HYA 2017, across primary classes, **in Hindi**, performance of students has decreased tremendously in class 3rd, it is improved in class 4th but again decreased in class 5th. **In English**, performance of students has decreased tremendously in class 3rd, 4th and 5th. **In Mathematics**, performance of students is low in class 4th in comparison of all other primary classes. **In EVS**, performance of students is good as more than 50% students are achieving more than 50% marks (Table 4).

Across upper primary classes, in September HYA 2017, **in Hindi**, performance of students is poor in class 6th and 7th; however, it is improved from class 6th to 8th. **In English, Mathematics, Social Studies and Science**, performance of students is poor in all three classes (Table 5).

Across Districts, **in Hindi**, students are performing well in all districts except Mewat in class 1st, 2nd and 8th. Performance of class 3 students is poor in all the districts except Rewari and Sonipat districts. In class 6th, performance is poor in all districts except Gurugram, Mahendergarh, Rewari and Sonipat. In Class 4th and 5th, performance of students is good in most of the districts. In class 7th, performance of students is poor in comparison of class 4th and 5th (Table 6).

In English, class 1st, 2nd students are performing well in all the districts except Mewat. In class 3rd and 8th students' performance is poor in all the districts except Sonipat; they need much attention and improvement. In Class 5th, students' performance is poor in all districts except Gurugram, Mahendergarh, Rewari and Sonipat. In class 4th, 6th and 7th, students are performing poorly in all the districts (Table 7).

In Mathematics also, class 1st, 2nd and 5th students are performing well in almost all districts except Mewat in class 1st and 5th. In Class 3rd, performance of students is well in most of the districts except Fatehabad, Jind, Kaithal, Mewat, Palwal and Yamuna Nagar. However in class 4th, performance of students is good in some districts named Ambala, Faridabad, Gurugram, Jhajjar, Mehendergarh, Panipat, Rewari and Sonipat. In class 6th and 7th, performance of students is poor in all the districts. In class 8th students are performing poor in all districts except Jhajjar, Mahendergarh and Sonipat (Table 8).

In Social Studies, across districts, students of class 6th and 7th are performing poorly except Sonipat in class 7th. They need much improvement. In class 8th also, students are performing poorly in most of the districts except Jhajjar, Mahendergarh, Rewari and Sonipat (Table 10).

In Science, performance of class 6th, 7th students' performance level is poor except Mahendergarh and Sonipat in class 7th. In class 8th, performance of student is good in only some districts named Bhiwani, Gurugram, Jhajjar, Mahendergarh, Panipat, Rewari, Rohtak and Sonipat. In rest of the districts, they are performing poorly (Table 11).

Conclusion:

In September HYA 2017, 97 % of schools have entered data. Attendance of students in September HYA 2017 is 94% at state level. Across districts, Mahendergarh and Sonapat district are in tie for first position. Rewari and Jhajjar districts are in tie for second position. Gurugram is at third position. It is important to note that in September half yearly assessment 2017, performance of Haryana students has decreased by 11% points. In July and August MAT, 57% of students were scoring more than 50% marks, which decreased to 46% in September HYA. This may be due to volume of syllabus assessed in HYA, which covers syllabus of September month as well as July and August month also.

In September HYA 2017, across primary classes, **in Hindi, performance** of students has decreased tremendously in class 3rd, it is improved in class 4th but again decreased in class 5th. **In English**, performance of students has decreased tremendously in class 3rd, 4th and 5th. **In Mathematics**, performance of students is low in class 4th in comparison of all other primary classes. **In EVS**, performance of students is good as more than 50% students are achieving more than 50% marks. Across upper primary classes, **in Hindi**, performance of students is poor in class 6th and 7th; however, it is improved from class 6th to 8th. **In English, Mathematics, Social Studies and Science**, performance of students is poor in all upper primary classes.
